Happy 2024! I hope all enjoyed a wonderful holiday season and that the New Year is off to a great start! We have been busy at the Senior Center since our last meeting. Some highlights I would like to share include:

# The Senior Center/COA holiday cookie distribution on Christmas Day

As discussed at our last meeting, this year we decided to bring back a cookie distribution that we did during COVID with the Newtown Police. The Department of Human Services identified 25 senior households which includes residents who were homebound or we knew would be alone on Christmas Day. We purchased 25 tins of cookies and included a label wishing them warm holiday wishes from the NSC and COA. The Newtown Police then delivered the cookies on Christmas Day. This month Alexa had the opportunity to meet with several residents and she looks forward to being back in February.

There are two grants that have become available for application from the Senior Center/Human Services. One is through WCAAA. I am currently in communication with the President of FONS, John Boccuzzi, on this one as we were successful in winning last year's grant which allowed for increased programming at the Senior Center. The second is through AARP with the award ranging from \$5-50,000. COA and FONS has begun brainstorming project ideas. I look forward to this continued conversation and hopefully putting together a successful grant application.

Finally, I am excited to announce that I have been asked to join two collaborative councils, the Community Council with Nuvance and the United Way Community Council. I have my first meeting with both groups coming up. I look forward to sharing more about how these partnerships will benefit our community at our next meeting.


