Commission on Aging Report: February 26, 2024

Dear Members of the COA,

Thank you for your support and the vote to purchase a shuffle board table for our Senior Center. The table has arrived and has been assembled. The wood is acclimating to the environment and will be ready for use later this week. Members are EAGER to get playing!

I would like to welcome Wendy Devereaux to our meetings as our new clerk. A member of our Human Services team and Senior Center staff, it's great to have Wendy in this role with the COA. I would also like to thank Beverly Bennett Schaedler for joining us today. Bev is a member of the Friends of Newtown Seniors Board (FONS) and runs the FONS Chore Services program. Chore Services plays a critical role in Human Services' efforts to support our senior residents, often involving assistance to help them to age in place. Bev will be sharing more about the work she does for the senior community through Chore and how COA and Chore Services can support each other.

As shared at our last meeting we are currently in the throes of two grant applications. Both grant applications are due early March. The WCAAA grant will be applied for by FONS to create a nutrition series at the Senior Center. We are working with Sean Fitzpatrick (Executive Director of Real Food CT), Judy Prager (Nutritionist/Wellfed CT), and Vicki Boccuzzi (FONS/Senior Center member) to design a program which will include an educational component and cooking demonstrations. The second grant is the Flagship Grant through AARP. The committee formed at our last meeting, consisting of members of COA, FONS, and DHS agreed to pursue the grant for enhancements to the patio project. If awarded we will look to these additional funds to connect the new front patio with the back patio area already established and add fencing to aid in privacy and safety, as a barrier from the parking lot.

BRING ME BACK HOME REGISTRY

What is the Bring Me Back Home Program?

Bring Me Back Home (BMBH) is a new registry for Connecticut residents which allows law enforcement access to information to assist in the recovery of missing or wandering persons. The provided information and photo, accessible through the COLLECT criminal justice and safety system, helps first responders and families reunite with individuals living with cognitive challenges, such as dementia or autism. This information is confidential and secure and can only be accessed by law enforcement personnel in an emergency.

How can we register?

To sign your loved one up for Bring Me Back Home, visit ct.gov/BMBH or scan the QR code below.

How does Bring Me Back Home work?

A family member or guardian registers their person with cognitive challenges through the link above, or in person at your nearest police department. This information is then part of the statewide Bring Me Back Home registry. When the person wanders or is missing, individuals should call 9-1-1 IMMEDIATELY, and indicate that they are registered with the Bring Me Back Home program. Law enforcement officers will have access to the confidential and secure information and respond appropriately.

Who is eligible?

All members of the community whose cognitive challenges may lead to confusion and disorientation, and who are at risk of wandering or getting lost.

Why is this important?

Wandering can be dangerous and life threatening. If not found within 24 hours, there is a much higher probability individuals may suffer serious injury or death.

For example, according to the Alzheimer's Association, 6 in 10 people living with dementia will wander. Alzheimer's disease, and other forms of dementia, can cause people to lose their ability to recognize familiar places and faces. This can happen at any stage of the disease and at any time of the day or night, this risk weighs heavily on caregivers and family.


