**Public Comment:** Police Officer Mary Helen McCarthy shared that she enjoys working with Natalie Griffith and her staff. The Police's goal is to get people the help that they need. Working with Human Services and Natalie Griffith, the people get the help they need and do an excellent job together. Also, an arrest was made after a four-month investigation by the police department for an incident of elder abuse with a patient who has dementia at a local rehabilitation facility.

**Minutes:** A. Rothestein moved to approve the minutes of the 2/26/24 meeting.W. Darrin seconded, all in favor.

**Director of Human Services:** Natalie Griffith reviewed her report. (att.). Natalie Griffith spoke about the two grants, AARP flagship grant was submitted on March 6th, this is to add enhancements to complement the AARPA grant already awarded to build a patio at the Newtown Senior Center. She is also meeting with The First Selectman and John Boccuzzi (FONS) to discuss a possible grant for transportation through The WCAAA. This grant could enhance the Hart Bus to fill holes in the transportation access for the senior community of Newtown. Natalie also commented that most basic benefits have been exhausted during the heating/energy season. With the help of community partners like The Lions, The Salvation Army, and the Newtown Fund emergency needs are being met.

The Women In Newtown are making 150 Easter Baskets for families with children who identify as in need through Human Services as well as Children's Adventure Center.

The Renter Rebate program is opening up on April 1st. This is a CT program for seniors or the disabled

to provide some compensation back for renters. \$900 for married couples and \$700 for single people. Based on a graduated income scale.

Every month Natalie submits a participation report for the Senior Center. Staff are working to encourage members to swipe in to get a more accurate participation rate.

Treasurer's Report: The Treasurer's Report was not received

**Old Business:** Discussion of the online Facebook survey with J. DeStefano (att.). 25 responses. COA members concluded that they do not see a need for a service for UR Community Cares at this time. This would be a duplication of services with Chore Services.

N. Griffith spoke on Beverly Bennett-Schaedler and her rides program through FONS. Rides for seniors to get folks out of the house for non-medical rides. A. Rothstein wants to keep educating people on the Chore Services.

#### No new business

Members Comments: B. Bloom mentions she wants to explore strategic planning to access any gaps in senior center programming throughout the day.

N. Griffith spoke about the Senior Center now that it is fully staffed and the Senior Center staff works very hard to fill the calendar with many activities daily. The staff are always open to new ideas and introductions to possible presenters and instructors. N. Griffith emphasized partnering with the COA to identify seniors in need of support and resources, not engaged with the senior center.

Having no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 4:55 pm.

Commission on Aging Report: March 18, 2024

Dear Members of the COA,

For those who celebrate, I hope you had a joyful St. Patrick's Day. Today is our own St. Patricks' celebration at the Senior Center. We are looking forward to a fun-filled event with live Irish music and a full, traditional St. Pat's meal prepared for us by the Blue Colony Diner. With spring in the air we look forward to several upcoming favorite annual events, including the Spring Fling in partnership with Parks and Recreation. The culinary program at NHS will be preparing a delicious meal and the Senior Center's own Matt Ames will be the DJ and MC again this year. He had the dance floor packed last year. We're optimistic this year is going to be an even bigger success!

On the grant front we submitted the Flagship Grant through AARP on March 6th. Notice of awards happen mid-May. If awarded we will look to these additional funds to connect the new front patio with the back patio area already established and add fencing to aid in privacy and safety, as a barrier from the parking lot. Later this week I will be meeting with the Selectman and the President of Friends of Newtown Seniors to discuss a grant opportunity through Western CT Area Agency on Aging for transportation. We will be discussing potential strategies to add additional service for older residents that will be in addition to existing service through the SweetHART bus. I will report back on this at our April meeting.

On the social services front a few key items to note:

Energy Assistance: we are at the tail end of the energy assistance program. The Connecticut Energy Assistance Program (CEAP) helps Connecticut residents afford to heat their homes. Basic benefits towards heating range between \$180 to \$530 depending on income level, household size and whether there is a vulnerable member in the household. At this point in the season we see many households have exhausted their benefit and need some additional assistance to get through heating season. DHS has been very fortunate to be able to meet these needs through funds for emergency aid in the Town budget and through our incredible partners who designate funds for heating assistance each year, most specifically the Lions, Salvation Army, and the Newtown Fund.

Easter Baskets: thanks for the annual effort of the Women In Newtown, today and tomorrow families identified by DHS as in need with small children are able to pick up an Easter basket for each child from our offices.

Renter's Rebate: State law provides a reimbursement program for Connecticut renters who are elderly or totally disabled, and whose incomes do not exceed certain limits. Persons renting an apartment or room or living in cooperative housing, or a mobile home may be eligible for this program. Renters' rebates can be up to \$900 for married couples and \$700 for single persons. The renters' rebate amount is based on a graduated income scale and the amount of rent and utility payments. This program opens applications on April 1st. Applications can be completed with Jackie Watson in our office.

Hope to see you on the dance floor with us at the Spring Fling, Friday, April 5th!



## What is your age?


